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A MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO & FOUNDER ANGEL GALVIS

At Mission Life, our longstanding vision has always been to empower and support children in discovering and achieving their mission in life. We understand that poverty often perpetuates from one generation to the next, creating a cycle that is difficult to break. When children are born into poverty, they face many challenges: Limited resources. Inadequate education. Unmet basic needs.

However, we believe the solution goes beyond providing material resources. It is a matter of transforming their mindset and beliefs. Breaking the cycle of poverty within vulnerable children begins with renewing their minds. We strive to accomplish this renewal by offering children opportunities to explore and develop their gifts and talents. We also focus on nurturing their understanding of values and principles, showing them unwavering love and care, and instilling hope as they discover their true purpose in life.

At Mission Life, we firmly believe that every child is capable of realizing their mission when given the right tools and a nurturing environment. When a child enters one of our development centers, they are warmly embraced with the love of Jesus. We encourage them to learn about God as their loving and compassionate Father, fostering a profound relationship with their Creator. This relationship provides restoration from the negative patterns society has taught them and marks the beginning of their mental and emotional transformation.

When a child completes our programs, they are equipped with the emotional and spiritual strength to face life's challenges head-on. They also understand the importance of serving a higher purpose in whatever they do and wherever they go in life.

This conviction, that each child can realize their mission in life, is the driving force behind our focus on revolutionizing the child sponsorship program with technology, video messages

and intentional relationships. Though child sponsorship has been in existence for more than 100 years and has benefited countless children, we believe there is still untapped potential for improvement. We strive to maximize the impact of these programs by designing every aspect of our operations to align with a clear purpose.

Examples of how we infuse purpose into every facet of the program include the following:

- Technology integration. We use technology to enhance communication between sponsors and children such as a mobile app, website and Zoom ensuring a more personalized
- and efficient connection.
- Video messages. We use the power of video messages to provide sponsors with a more immersive and intimate understanding of the child's daily life, progress and aspirations.
- Intentional relationships. We encourage intentional relationships not only between sponsors and children, but also within the entire support network including local communities and program staff to create a comprehensive support system.

These examples illustrate our commitment to redefining child sponsorship by ensuring that each element serves a purpose in fulfilling the mission of empowering every child to realize their potential and mission in life.

To further solidify our operational effectiveness, our development centers have comprehensive operation manuals, introducing a level of organization previously foreign to many places and countries. Completing these manuals and training our team members were monumental achievements for our young organization. These milestones set the stage for an even more impactful 2024, where we envision expanding our influence in the lives of all our children and communities.

As our journey continues into 2024, our primary goal is to ensure all the children still waiting to be sponsored are matched with individuals who genuinely believe in helping them realize their mission and break free from the cycle of poverty. By nurturing their talents, providing them with essential resources and support, and fostering a sense of purpose, we are confident that these children can overcome the barriers of poverty and achieve their full potential.

Sponsor experience. Our manuals outline the importance of transparency throughout the child sponsorship process. By providing clear and timely communication and fostering strong relationships between sponsors and children, we engage our sponsors to create a connection with the children they sponsor.

In Kimironko, Kigali, Rwanda, 36 children graduated this year from our pilot preschool program at the Child Hope Center. This program – designed to provide education, physical nurturing and Christian values – easing financial burdens for single moms in this community.

With the support of our dedicated team of educators and volunteers, the Child Hope Center pioneered this journey, empowering the city's young minds. The graduation day was a vibrant celebration, with children showcasing their newfound knowledge and skills.





Dressed in their finest attire, the children took the stage, reciting memorized pieces and performing songs with confidence. The audience – filled with parents, guardians and community members – erupted in applause, witnessing the remarkable achievements of these young graduates.

As the ceremony concluded, the children received their graduation certificates, symbolizing their hard work and determination. This moment marked the beginning of a new chapter, filled with endless opportunities and the belief that every child can shape their destiny.

The success of the Child Hope Centers in Kigali has extended beyond this inaugural graduation. Now equipped to educate children in grades one and two of primary school, the centers continue to thrive, touching the lives of countless more children. This achievement has made the centers a symbol of hope, where dreams take root, flourish and the first steps toward a better tomorrow.

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






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IMPACT-RWANDA

Over the course of the past five years, our association with the Africa Hope Initiatives has become a testament to the boundless love of God for the vulnerable. At the helm of the Child Centers' operations is Bishop Theo, whose leadership has been instrumental in overseeing the initiatives carried out in the three centers located in Rwanda. These centers are steadily progressing toward sustainability, with one already a quarter of the way there.

As we look back on the accomplishments of 2023, we are happy to share how many children we reached in Rwanda: A total of 478 children were served across the three operational centers and one that is soon to be launched.

Bishop Theo oversees a network of more than 80 churches in Rwanda, Uganda and The Republic of Congo, whose leaders have witnessed firsthand the positive outcomes of Mission Life's sponsorship program. And now, many rural churches away from the Hope Centers have been encouraged by success stories and have taken proactive steps to position themselves as potential Child Centers for sponsorship.

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IMPACT-COLOMBIA

Throughout the year, our child centers in Colombia have been dedicated to providing engaging activities and learning opportunities for the children, resulting in progress for each child. These initiatives encompass activities focused on learning verses and Bible stories, emphasis on understanding the attributes of God and empowering the children to apply these teachings in their daily lives.



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In Bogota, our center in Santa Cecilia came together to provide children with a unique and enriching experience. The children immersed themselves in traditional disciplines such as theater and dance and expanded their horizons by learning new and exciting skills. Each child participated according to her special abilities and talents, from acting to dancing and singing.

We introduced programs that included teaching breakdancing, circus and aerial fabric dancing. These artistic disciplines not only offered a unique experience, but also gave children the opportunity to explore new forms of expression and develop physical and cognitive skills.



In the breakdancing program, children discovered the energy and creativity of this form of urban dance, letting them to express themselves in a unique way. The circus offered them the opportunity to develop balance, coordination and teamwork skills, while exploring exciting acrobatics and juggling. Aerial fabric dancing allowed them to soar to new heights, building confidence and discipline.

We are delighted to see how these programs have enriched children's lives, not only providing them with artistic skills, but also bringing them closer to life and letting them discover new passions. We believe these experiences will contribute significantly to their personal development and open a world of creative possibilities. We look forward to continuing to provide children with opportunities that inspire their growth and give them the tools to achieve their dreams.

Another shining example is the Child Center in Barrancas, Bogota, where many enriching activities and learning opportunities unfolded this year. We adopted two distinct work methodologies at our center, starting with a two-week bible camp called Discovery Land, a teaching approach that promotes active learning through dynamic methods.

Discovery Land dynamic methods include weekly goals, providing a hands-on and active learning experience, encouraging children to experiment and gain concrete knowledge in activities centered on verses, Bible stories and the attributes of God. The central theme for this year's camp was dinosaurs, offering children the chance to create their own desserts, conduct chemical and physical experiments related to dinosaurs, and participate in various sports activities tied to the theme.

These experiences fostered creativity and contributed to a better understanding of different subjects.



WE AIM TO ESTABLISH TWO NEW CENTERS IN: CARTAGO, COLOMBIA, AND NYAMATA, RWANDA

CARTAGO CHILD CENTER

In my hometown of Cartago, I was taken aback by the immense need of the children and young people in the community. They lacked hope, and nothing had changed since I left. The same issues that motivated me to move to the U.S. for a better future remained.

When God gave me the vision for Mission Life, my motivation was to help the children in the place where I grew up. However, this dream has not yet been fulfilled. In the seven years since Mission Life started, many of you have witnessed the miracles God has made possible through our partnerships. One of these miracles is the story of the Hermond Church in Kigali, Rwanda. The community could not congregate due to the government's closure of the tent they used to meet in. But thanks to your partnership, we contributed to constructing a church for this community in Kigali. Our child center is now operating in the same building, and more than 200 children and youth come to learn about Jesus, have a meal and explore their purpose in life.

We aim to replicate what we accomplished in Kigali by rebuilding the church and creating a new child center in Cartago, Colombia. This center will provide support to more than 400 children in the surrounding communities.

The spirit of resilience is alive in Cartago as we witness the ongoing efforts to rebuild the church that, over 10 years, has been abandoned and is in desperate need of rebuilding. Still, together, we are rebuilding not only a structure, but also a symbol of hope and unity for these communities.
